- Register with e-scrip (yes, it's the same site where you register your Vons card!)

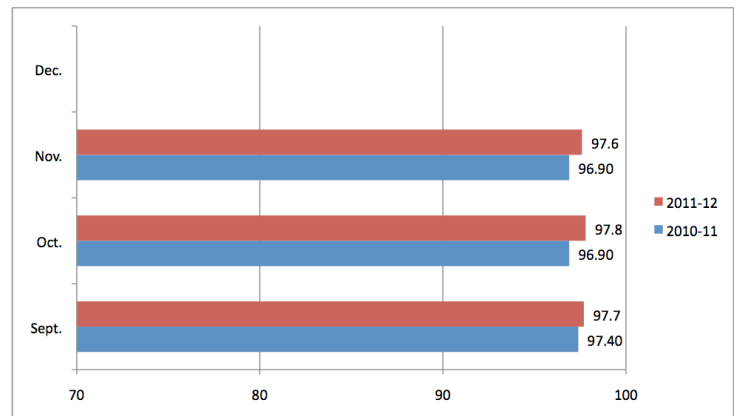
During the conference, students completed their **Learner Profile Report Card** as part of our International Baccalaureate Program. The IB Learner Profile is the IBO mission statement translated into a set of learning outcomes for the 21st century. The attributes of the profile express the values inherent to the IB continuum of international education. It is a set of ideals that inspire, motivate and focus our work with a common purpose. You are your child's first teacher and instill these strong values with your child at home. We are privileged to work with you in this fabulous journey.

Attendance Counts

Thank you for making sure our students attend school on time every day. As of November 30, McKinley's portion of lost ADA (Average Daily Attendance) to our district totals \$17,064. With the cold and flu season here, I know you will take every measure to keep your child healthy for school!

At the end of November, McKinley's attendance was 97.68%. We are ranked 10th in the district out of 118 elementary schools! This ranking has increased from 13th as of October 31st! Classes with the best attendance for the month of November were Mrs. Som and Mr. Pike. Classes received a certificate and a health snack from the principal. Sun, Moon and Stars

Did you know that Saturn's rings are younger than Saturn itself? Scientists found this out by the water ice on the rings. The rings are made of water ice, dust and other chemicals. Saturn's rings increase Saturn's brightness. In 1610, Galileo Galilei was the first person to see Saturn's rings through a telescope, but he did not know what they were. In 1655, Christiaan Huygens saw the rings through a telescope and described them to people. Saturn's rings are about 100 million years old.

The Sun was first named in Greece as Helios. In ancient Roman times, they called the Sun 'Sol' and that is why our planets are called the Solar System.

Did you know that Mars has volcanoes that don't erupt anymore?

All McKinley third graders have been studying these and other interesting facts during their Sun, Moon and Stars unit of study.
